Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If you're like me, you're probably ready for some spring! I know that there are a few who love winter and I hope that you're having a good time; but as for me and my house...GIVE US THE WARM WEATHER!

I love spring for lots of reasons...longer and warmer days, the frequent sightings of robins, geese flying overhead, green life emerging above the surface, budding trees, early flowers blooming, the birth of new life and the general feeling of hope that is reborn after enduring the cold of winter. The last few days have awaken a new found love for spring...**messiness**. I know that sounds crazy, but think about it. Spring is messy! For every glorious, blue sky, sun filled spring day, there are ones of cold and rain, and even snow! There is mud, wind and frost. There is dog waste, bird droppings and litter. Yet, in the midst of this messiness, growth is always happening and we are still progressing towards summer.

Council Notes 04-17-23 Mtg

The church's electric bill has been quite high due to the heat pumps being shut off for the months of February and March.

Church attendance through Lent and Easter services were strong. The Youth will meet to discuss distribution of their Wednesday Lenten meal money for mission organizations. Senior recognition at ULC will be May 28. Still looking for a few individuals to attend Synod Assembly with Pastor Jodi.

Over \$3100 was raised from the VBS cake auction. VBS will be held May 30-June 2.

Steve reported that the roofing company is hoping to be here at the end of April for repair of the east wing.

The church's property insurance has gone up considerable from last year. This is due to replacement costs of labor and material. The church properties have also increased in value by 30%.

Terry presented a general outline of the process if we should consider sponsoring Kerlange and her family from Haiti. He suggested forming a refugee committee to further explore information on this process prior to making further decisions.

Outdoor picnic is scheduled for July 23 and an outdoor church service for July 2 at Mt. Carmel Dam instead of here at the church.

Julie asked for permission to find someone to paint the fireside/family room. It has needed painting since the ductwork was installed with the new HVAC system.

Council minutes and treasurer's report are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

Mental Health Awareness....Change

Change is in everywhere...a new season, weather, end of the school year, graduation, a new diagnosis, a loss, a new relationship, summer planning, a new project. Some changes are difficult, others are joy filled and exciting. Change is an inevitable part of life, but knowing that, doesn't mean dealing with change is easy. Finding ways to accept and cope can make these transitions smoother and less troubling.

Change requires adjustments. Sometimes these can be small things like finding a new way to do something or adding a new step to some of your daily routines. In other cases, you might find that change introduces significant disruptions to the way you live your life. This can create **stress** or feelings of anxiety and depression in some cases. This doesn't mean change is always bad. But even good changes can be stress-inducing. Things might not have been perfect before, but you may have been comfortable in your previous state of equilibrium. You had a routine. You knew what to expect, so you weren't thrown off by surprises or unexpected challenges.

As change happens, your routines are disrupted. You suddenly have to adapt as you are pushed further and further out of your comfort zone. The stress these changes bring can feel overwhelming at times. And it can have negative effects on both your physical and mental well-being. Stress can manifest itself in many ways, including: anxiety, changes in appetite, depression or sadness, irritability, muscle pain, problems sleeping, digestion issues, tension headaches and trouble concentrating.

You can't always control change, but you can manage how you respond to those changes. Developing a positive mindset is a great way to promote resilience. Mentally preparing yourself during times of transition is also essential. It is also important to care for yourself. When things are in flux, you might find that you neglect many of your basic needs. Stressful events often seem much worse when you are exhausted or hungry, so taking some time to attend to your basic needs by eating a healthy meal, getting some rest or just taking a walk are beneficial. Try as much as possible to stick to a routine and ask your loved ones for help when you need an extra hand. Friends, loved ones and other social connections can provide support in various ways when you are dealing with changes in your life.

If you are having difficulty dealing with change, talk to your healthcare provider or mental health professional. They can recommend treatments that may help. If you are in immediate distress or are thinking about hurting yourself, call or text the **988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline** at **988** or chat at **988lifeline.org**.

Haiti Mission

During Pentecost, we feel more than ever the Holy Spirit's call...a stirring and awakening. I wonder if the Spirit is calling us to something new?

Meet our friends, Kerlange and Armstrong and their children, Zeke (3 1/2) and Hannah (almost 1)! They live in Ste. Marc, Haiti and have become friends of United through Seeds of Support for Haiti. Kerlange and Armstrong have continued working for us by distributing food and organizing a general health clinic in a village several hours from where they live. They visit and pray with the



patients who are scared and lonely. Kerlange often shares what she has with the people around her and her generosity in spite of having little herself is amazing.

The situation in Haiti continues to go from bad to worse. Kidnappings, hijackings, assault and terrorizing by gangs increase in number daily. It has been reported by the UN that 60% of the capital city of Port-au-Prince is controlled by gangs. Most of the food staples such as rice and beans and cooking oil are imported into the country. Food prices have more than doubled in the last six months. Several times in the last several months Kerlange has texted Janet Jacobson that she had no food in the house and what money they had was in the bank and the bank had not opened for weeks. Even when the markets and banks are open, it is often too dangerous to go out to buy food. She is unable to send Zeke to preschool because it is too dangerous for little ones to travel to school by motorbike taxi. We (United) responded with a special offering taken just before Christmas.

A note from Janet J..."Kerlange texted me and asked if we could sponsor her and her family. How can I tell her that there is no room for them in our midst? We are asking for help from our church family and others to support them financially. We are also asking for a commitment to help welcome Kerlange, Armstrong, Zeke and Hannah to our community where they will be safe, fed and loved."

On March 20, the United Lutheran Church Council voted in favor of looking into the protocol and logistics of sponsoring or cosponsoring a Haitian family. No decision has been made on pursuing sponsorship. We are in the initial phase of investigation. Janet and Terry Jacobson will take lead in this endeavor to provide the church with more information. Please feel free to talk to one of the council representatives, Terry, Janet, or myself if you would like further information or would like to be on a committee that will do further work on this project.
