Christ's Body in this World

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"Now all of you together are Christ's body, and each one of you is a separate and necessary part of it." 1 Corinthians 12:27

It's pretty amazing, don't you think, that when the Apostle Paul reached out to find a metaphor to adequately describe the church of Jesus Christ, he came back time and time again to that of the human body. Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. Each of us makes up a part of the body of Christ! Why would Paul use this particular illustration to describe the Church? In what sense is the Church the body of Christ?

Well, as we know, Christ has ascended to His Father in heaven, where He is seated at the right hand of the Father. His saving work here on earth has been accomplished through His death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead. Now...Today, the presence of God and the presence of Christ in His Church and in the individual believer is enacted through the gift of the Holy Spirit. But the Holy Spirit...is A SPIRIT who does not have a body in this world! So **we** are Christ's body in this world! We are His Hands to do His Work! We are His voice, His feet, His ears, His nose, His presence! It is up to us to do His work, to preach His gospel and to carry His message into the world!

In essence, that's what "God's Work. Our Hands" Sunday is all about. It is a reminder to us that we have been given a huge responsibility here on earth as the church...as the body of Christ. On Sunday, September 10, as we are sent from our pews out through the doors, we put into

action a small portion of what it means to carry out the work of the Body of Christ. We will minister to ourselves and others as Christ has intended. Inspired by the Holy Spirit and under the guidance of our Stewardship Committee, we will bring love and kindness, service and caring to others through the work of our hands.

*Please note, expenses include a \$30,000 transfer from the general fund in January and a \$20,000 transfer from the general fund in July. Both transfers were moved in to the dedicated building fund.

As of August 29, our Endowment Fund balance was \$102,635.45. If you would like to make a contribution to the Endowment Fund, please make checks payable to "InFaith Foundation" (which manages our endowment fund). Interest accrued yearly from this Endowment fund has been used at the end of each year to give back to needs within our community or special projects within the church.

Mental Health Awareness...Social Media

Do you start your day by checking your social media accounts? And end your day the same way? Maybe you pop back in throughout the day for quick check-ins...but, before you realize it, you've scrolled through recent posts for nearly an hour. This isn't all that uncommon. After all, social media use is pretty widespread. In the United States alone, 72 percent of people reported using some type of social media in 2021, according to Pew Research Center.

You might already know social media can potentially hamper mental health. But you might have less awareness of exactly how. Unhealthy behaviors associated with social media use include:

Comparing oneself excessively to others
Cyberbullying
Experiencing the fear of missing out (FOMO)
Loneliness

Many studies have linked social media use to poorer mental health outcomes, especially among younger people. A systematic review found that excessive time spent using social media was associated with increased loneliness and depression. Research has shown that reducing social media use may have the opposite effect. One study found that college students who limited social media use for three weeks showed significantly reduced loneliness and <u>depression</u> compared to those with unlimited use.

All that being said, social media can have plenty of upsides, too. Social media can potentially help promote improved well-being by connecting you with resources and people. Whether you're searching for support groups, informative articles, or valuable tools and tips, social media can provide access to multiple resources. Social media can also break down some of the barriers people face when trying to access resources such as support groups and healthcare professionals.

Developing a healthy relationship with social media starts with recognizing it as a tool. Like most things, social media can be used for good or it can become problematic when used incorrectly or in excess. The effect social media has on your mental health often comes down to how you use it and why. Case in point: Social media can lead you to feel more isolated and alone. But it can also help you connect with people going through similar life challenges or exploring the same interests.

Ultimately, the key to building a better relationship with social media lies in exploring how your use affects *you*. Small steps and more thoughtful use can lead to an improved relationship with social media and yourself. Keep in mind, too, that social media apps tend to be designed to keep you engaged and actively using them. So, you might not always find it easy to cut back on your own. If that's the case for you, a therapist can offer more guidance and support with setting boundaries for more mindful social media use.
