Fountain or a Drain?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"For You are the Fountain of Life; the light by which we see." Psalm 36:9

I find it so refreshing, energizing and rejuvenating to watch kids splash and giggle as they run through sprinklers or fountains on a hot summer day. It makes me smile and happy inside. So...when I happened upon the phrase..."Be a fountain, not a drain!" It got me thinking...

Am I most often a fountain or a drain? How about you?

Are you most often a fountain or a drain? Do people leave your presence refreshed, encouraged, uplifted and inspired, or are they discouraged, down and tired? Fountains refresh, revive and sustain. Drains remove, deplete and suck the life out of people.

Your very presence can encourage and empower or discourage and de-energize. When you choose to be fully present and listen deeply, you demonstrate respect and people feel it. When you express sincere curiosity and interest, it lifts a person's spirit. However, when you judge and criticize or ignore and dismiss another person, it has the opposite effect. Being a fountain is all about truly caring about others and not just yourself. There is nothing more powerful than a simple act of kindness. On the contrary, words like gratitude, joy, appreciation, support, happy, excited, and amazing bring a life-giving spirit into the communication.

You will be a either a fountain or a drain today. It is your choice. You will bring life, or death, to those around you. Your words will influence their thoughts, and that will affect their emotion and energy. I encourage to "Be a Fountain" and choose to make a positive difference in someone's life. Bring a sip of water to a thirsty soul! Giving is the greatest joy and a fountain that is overflowing!

Council Notes 06-17-24 Mtg

Pastor Jodi lead in devotions from Philippians 4:4-9 to begin the meeting. She indicated Vacation Bible School went very well. Coordination and leadership with Metigoshe Ministries was great.

Pastor Jodi and LeeAnn spoke about Synod Assembly they attended on June 1-2. The theme was "Challenge: Learn, Discern, Respond". Giving to the Synod has been decreasing yearly from the churches in our Eastern ND Synod but giving is also down in other Synods.

Much discussion was held about the current leaking of the roof. A motion was approved to move forward with a pitched roof over the fellowship hall, kitchen and narthex. Estimates will be obtained from Marcotte Builders and the Langdon Building Center. Since this will be a larger project than what was originally anticipated, there will be a special congregational meeting to vote on approval of the project.

The Outdoor Worship and picnic will be held July 28. Worship will still be held on the front lawn but the picnic portion will be held in the fellowship hall.

Council minutes and treasurer's report are posted monthly on the bulletin board in the hall across from the church kitchen.

2024 END Synod Assembly

On June 1-2, 2024, the Eastern North Dakota Synod, ELCA gathered together at the Holiday Inn in Fargo, ND for the thirty-seventh annual Synod Assembly under the theme of "Challenge: Learn, Discern, Respond." There were a total of 296 people in attendance (183 Lay Voting Members; 80 Rostered Minister Voting Members; 33 Visitors). The business items included hearing reports from officers, adopting the 2025 Synod Mission Plan (budget), elections for Synod Council, Committees, and Voting Members to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly and adopting two resolutions. The resolutions were on Compensation and Benefit Guidelines for 2025 and a Reconciling in Christ Welcome Statement.

Participants also heard a State of the Synod from Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth and State of the ELCA from our churchwide representative, Kristen Opalinski. We had two worship services with an emphasis on our indigenous ministries in Opening Worship and care for creation at our Closing Worship with the Rev. Deborah Blood, UCC Conference Minister, preaching. Two keynote presentations were shared by Dr. Kelly Sherman-Conroy, Native Theologian.

There were seven workshops offered for participants on a variety of topics. Rostered Ministers and Congregations celebrating significant anniversaries were acknowledged. The Strategic Plan for the Synod was launched thanks to a year-long process of listening and discerning across the synod. A reception was held to celebrate five new Endowment Funds that have been created. The 2025 Synod Assembly will be held on June 7-8, 2025.

Thank you to generous congregations and individuals for contributing to this year's offering at Synod Assembly. Over \$10,400 has been raised for the Native American Endowment Fund.

Bishop Tessa shared the process for listening and discerning to create our mission, name our core values and create ministry result areas.
